State Salmon Recovery Act (RCW 77.85)



Lead Entity Background





Established by RCW 77.85.050



Local, watershed-based restoration organization

e.g.– Tribe, Non-profit, County or Conservation District



Solicit, develop, prioritize and submit habitat protection and restoration projects to the SRFB for funding

26 Lead Entities Statewide

State Coordination: Governor's Salmon Recovery Office

7 regional organizations

- Local recovery plans adopted by NOAA
- Coordinate implementation of recovery plans

26 Lead Entities

Citizen and technical committees that develop and vet projects



Spokane Salmon Restoration Collaborative Mission



Develop a habitat restoration strategy and implement habitat projects that support salmon reintroduction and preservation of native redband trout in the Spokane River Watershed



Focal Species

non-ESA listed spring and summer/fall Chinook native Redband Trout (ancestrally linked to extant Steelhead)

Technical Committee



Technical Committee

- Comprised of local, technical experts
- Knowledgeable about local watershed, habitat, and fish conditions
- Guide development of habitat restoration plan
- Provide expertise on priorities and habitat projects
- Rate habitat projects on technical merit

Actions to Date

- Formed Spring 2022
- RFP Development and Selection of Cramer Fisheries to Conduct Data Gap Analysis and EDT Modeling
- Oversight and Input into EDT Sampling Plan and Data Collection
- Intern Job Description
- Sharing Related Habitat Projects and Receiving SSRC Support Letters

Next Step: Form Citizens Committee



Citizens Committee

- Comprised of local residents; representatives of local, state, federal, and tribal governments; community groups, environmental and fisheries groups; conservation districts; and industries
- Ensure priorities and projects have community support
- Review and approve habitat project list based on community values
- Submit list to SRFB for funding

Formation Steps

- Each Initiating Government Selects Representative
- Convene Initiating Governments
- Initiating Governments Select & Invite Committee Membership
- Create Charter/By-Laws
